**Changes to the Agenda**

Mayor Ed Sisson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Also present were Councilmembers Bill Raley, Robert Jurca, Mary Cooper, and Ray Penick along with City Manager Justin Clifton and City Attorney David McConaughy. A meeting notice was posted in the south window at City Hall at least twenty-four hours prior to the meeting.

**Pledge of Allegiance**

The Mayor led everyone present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Changes to the Agenda**

There were none.

**Minutes**

It was moved by Councilmember Raley and seconded by Councilmember Penick to approve the minutes of the October 7, 2014 regular meeting as submitted by the Clerk. All in favor, motion carried.

**Citizen Comments**

There were none.

**Discussion with MEAN**

City Manager Justin Clifton stated that Gary Stauffer with Municipal Energy Agency of Nebraska (MEAN) is here tonight to provide Council some information regarding MEAN.

Mr. Stauffer provided a brief overview of MEAN and its structure. He stated that MEAN's main objective is to serve the wholesale requirement of their individual members.

Mr. Stauffer reported on the following items:

- The City of Delta moving from a contract status to full membership and how that affected rates.
- The Rated A Table.
- The Southwest Power Pool (SPP) settlement agreement.
- The rate structure and how that has affected the overall deficit that MEAN has faced over the last three years.
- MEAN's ability to adjust expenses.
- Federal regulations regarding solar and wind power.
- How MEAN comprises their budget.

There were several discussions regarding the SPP settlement and the lack of transparency with MEAN members.

**Regular Meeting, Delta City Council, October 21, 2014 (cont.)**

**Discussion with MEAN (cont.)**

Mr. Stauffer addressed Delta specifically regarding the rate increases. He stated that he asked for a five year cost analysis for Delta. Until October of 2012 Delta was on a fixed contract. In 2010 the city's total cost was \$2.7 million and in 2011 it was \$2.6 million. In October of 2012 the city moved to an ownership contract and the cost was \$2.8 million and in 2013 it went up to \$3.5 million.

There was additional discussion regarding the rate structure. He is hopeful that within the next six months rates will stabilize. He also stated that the war on coal is going to have significant consequences. The future holds some really rough waters.

Manager Clifton questioned if it's possible to track costs over time and see evidence in numbers in whatever expense controlling mechanics that may be put into place or justification for added costs.

Mr. Stauffer stated that his staff gives detailed information to the representatives. There is any level of detail the City would like. If the city is not getting they information they need, let him know and he will get it.

Ron Bell, 1230 E. 7<sup>th</sup> Street, commented on the ultimate impact rates will have on consumers. He stated that consumers have to push back on the regulations. Energy and food have to be the two best values.

**Council Bill #4, 2014; First Reading**  
**Vacating Segments of 12<sup>th</sup> Street and Main Street**

Council Bill #4, 2014

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DELTA, COLORADO,  
VACATING SEGMENTS OF TWELFTH STREET AND MAIN  
STREET IN DELTA, CO

was introduced and read by the Clerk.

Manager Clifton stated that this ordinance dedicates certain property that was conveyed from the City to the Stockyards Restaurant and vacating a portion of 12<sup>th</sup> Street so that 50% of that right of way reverts to each owner. All of the deeds and other instruments have been previously approved by Council in a settlement agreement that has already been executed.

It was moved by Councilmember Cooper and seconded by Councilmember Jurca to adopt Council Bill #4, 2014 on first reading. Roll call vote: Councilmembers Cooper, aye; Penick, aye; Jurca, aye; Raley, aye and Sisson, aye. Motion carried.

**Approval of Quit Claim Deed with Delta Holdings**

Manager Clifton stated that is was agreed that when the railroad abandoned the rail spur at 430 8<sup>th</sup> Street and when the City had possession of the property the City would quit claim a part of the property back to Delta Holdings.

## **Regular Meeting, Delta City Council, October 21, 2014 (cont.)**

### **Approval of Quit Claim Deed with Delta Holdings (cont.)**

Councilmember Penick questioned if this was also in a previous agreement.

Manager Clifton stated that is correct.

It was moved by Councilmember Penick and seconded by Councilmember Raley to allow the Mayor to sign the quit claim deed for the property at 430 8<sup>th</sup> Street with Delta Holdings after staff approval. All in favor, motion carried.

### **Truck Route Update**

Manager Clifton reported that there is a lot going on and so he wanted to provide Council with an update. He stated that staff is still looking at completing this project this year. He provided Council a schedule for paving.

Manager Clifton stated that in terms of the budget there have been a couple of small overruns and there are a number of cost savings that have not been captured yet. He also stated that nothing has changed overall since Council budgeted for the completion of the project back in November of 2013.

The following local issues were discussed:

- The rail arm on Hwy 348.
- Delta Elevator access.

Over the course of change in personnel, staff has not lost any time. Mr. Clifton thanked Community Development Director Glen Black for stepping into the role to oversee the project and keeping the project on track.

### **Hotel/Restaurant Liquor License Renewals**

The Clerk stated that Fiesta Vallarta and Devil's Thumb Golf Club has submitted their hotel/restaurant liquor license renewals. Both applications are complete and all fees have been paid. The police department is recommending approval for both businesses.

It was moved by Councilmember Jurca and seconded by Councilmember Raley to approve the hotel/restaurant liquor license renewals for Fiesta Vallarta and Devil's Thumb Golf Club. All in favor, motion carried.

### **City Attorney Comments**

David McConaughy reported on meeting with Jim Brown regarding the City's water files.

**Recommendation:**

Staff recommends Council consider the enclosed draft budget and recommend any changes in advance of final approval, scheduled for November 18, 2014.

**Background:**

The enclosed draft budget is very similar to all department presentations previously made. Changes are mostly related to fixing small errors in numbers, refining 2014 estimates and massaging numbers slightly up or down based on refined analysis.

In addition to the budget documents you also have some brief highlights to consider. I have also included an outline of the consolidation scenario pending the results of the election on November 4, 2014.

**Cost:**

See draft budget.

**Alignment With Strategic Planning:**

Article V of the City Charter requires the draft budget be given to Council prior to November 1, 2014 and adopted prior to December 1, 2014.

**Actions To Be Taken if Approved:**

Staff will make any changes as directed by Council and prepare the final budget for consideration November 18, 2014.

**COUNCIL BILL #4, 2014**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DELTA, COLORADO, VACATING SEGMENTS OF TWELFTH STREET AND MAIN STREET IN DELTA, CO.**

WHEREAS, under Article I, Section 3 of Delta's Municipal Charter, and under C.R.S. 31-15-702(1)(a) and 43-2-303(1)(a), the City has general municipal power to vacate streets and roadways, particularly those that are determined not to be needed for public purposes; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has approved an agreement between the City and Jeri Roberts and Dianne Anderson, proprietors of the Stockyards restaurant dated June 1, 2013 that stipulates vacation of segments of Twelfth Street and Main Street, and;

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that vacating the subject segments of Twelfth Street and Main Street will not result in the isolation of any private land from public access, and is especially warranted by circumstances surrounding the completion of the City's Alternate Truck Route, and

WHEREAS, the area proposed for vacation by this Ordinance is outside any documented right of way for U.S. Highway 50; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that its actions contemplated under this ordinance will otherwise comply with applicable provisions of law set forth in C.R.S. 43-2-101 *et seq.*

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of Delta, Colorado as follows:

1. The recitals set forth above are incorporated by reference as findings of the Delta City Council.
2. The aforementioned segments of Twelfth Street and Main Street, as specifically described and mapped by the attached Exhibit A are hereby permanently vacated; provided, however, that a portion of the vacated area as designated on Exhibit A as the "utility easement" area is nevertheless hereby permanently reserved as a public easement held by the City of Delta for the continued use, operation, maintenance, repair and replacement of all existing sewer, gas, water, or similar pipelines and appurtenances, and for electric, telephone, and similar lines and appurtenances as deemed necessary by the Delta City Council.
3. Title to the vacated street segments, subject to the aforementioned reservations, shall vest in

the owners of adjoining lands according to the provisions of C.R.S. 43-2-302(1)(c).

4. The City's Mayor and Clerk, in consultation with the City Attorney, are hereby authorized to make, execute, obtain and record any and all documentation that they may deem necessary or prudent for the proper implementation of this ordinance and for the revision of official maps of the City.

**Recommendation:**

Staff is recommending the adoption of Council Bill #5, 2014 increasing the utility rates for electric effective January 1, 2015.

**Background:**

During the budget work sessions, staff presented Council with proposed increases to utility rates in the electric utility fund. Rate increases are necessary to help balance revenues over expenditures. Attached, please find a comparison of current rates to proposed rates.

**Cost:**

The only cost is to publish the ordinance in a local newspaper as required by Charter.

**Alignment With Strategic Planning:**

The City Charter states, "The City Council shall by ordinance establish regulations and fix rates to be charged for electric service furnished by the City owned and operated electric light and power plant and system, provide for the orderly administration of the department to be administered as an entity, and impose fines and penalties for the violation thereof.", for the Department of Light and Power. Council is further charged with preparing a budget that provides for revenues to exceed expenditures for each fund within the City by the Charter.

**Actions To Be Taken if Approved:**

The ordinance will be published as required by Charter and rates will be set to take effect January 1, 2015.

Council Bill #5, 2014

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DELTA, COLORADO, PROVIDING REVISED ELECTRIC RATES AND AMENDING THE MUNICIPAL CODE CONCERNING THE SAME.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article IV of the Home Rule Charter and Title 31 the City is responsible for setting the fees and costs associated with the operation of municipal utilities within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is desirous of amending the municipal code to correct the electric fees/rates table.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DELTA, COLORADO, as follows:

**Section 1.** The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein as findings of the City Council.

**Section 2.** Amending sections 13.04.260 of the Delta Municipal Code as follows:

**Section 4. Severability.** Each section of this Ordinance is an independent section and a holding of any section or part thereof to be unconstitutional, void or ineffective for any cause shall not be deemed to affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section or part thereof.

**Section 5. Safety Clause.** The City Council hereby finds, determines, and declares that this Ordinance is promulgated pursuant to the City's home rule authority and under the general

police power of the City of Delta and that it is promulgated for the protection of health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City of Delta. The City Council further determines that this Ordinance bears a rational relationship to the legislation proposed herein.

**Section 6. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after final publication as provided in City Charter and C.R.S. section 31-16-105.





- Each parade must organize and stage on 9<sup>th</sup> Street from Grand Avenue to Main Street with additional staging area on Main Street from 9<sup>th</sup> Street to 11<sup>th</sup> Street on the East side. The parade must then travel North on Main Street to 4<sup>th</sup> Street, turning off of Main Street, East onto 4<sup>th</sup> Street.
- Throwing candy and other items from moving vehicles is prohibited.

I understand that the City of Delta has no liability and provides no insurance for the protection of the applicant or event spectators. The applicant agrees to save and hold harmless the City and its employees from any and all claims and demands arising out of the use of the permitted areas and will defend any cause of action brought to enforce any such claims or demands against the City and/or its Employees.
